# Thornden School Annie Audition Pack For students in Years 7, 8, 9 & 10



Please read this audition pack carefully. It will give you details about what to expect from the auditions themselves, details about the production and some important dates which you will need to know if you are given a role in the show.

Performance Dates: 17th, 18th, 19th & 20th July 2024

\*Please do not audition for the production if you already know that you cannot make any of the dates above.

# Please check that you are also available for all key dates below:

### **Production week dates:**

(You will need to be available for ALL of these dates in 2024 if you decide to audition):

Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> July – Sitzprobe (Orchestra & ALL singers who use microphones) 3pm – 6pm

**Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> July –** Weekend intensive rehearsal 10am – 5pm

**Monday 15**<sup>th</sup> & **Tuesday 16**<sup>th</sup> **July –** Technical & Dress rehearsals (during school day and until 5.30pm)

Wednesday 17th July - Live Dress rehearsal (during day) & Performance 1 @7pm

Thursday 18th July - Performance 2 @7pm

Friday 19th July - Performance 3 @7pm

Saturday 20th July - Performance 4 @7pm

# Rehearsal dates:

<u>Tuesdays after school from 3pm – 5pm</u>. Please be available for all rehearsals. Students may be requested to take part in occasional break or lunch rehearsals. Attendance at the Sunday intensive rehearsal and the final dress & tech rehearsals (dates above) will be mandatory for anyone taking part.

# **Audition Dates**

Years 7 & 8: Monday 4th March: 3 - 5pm

Year 7 & 8 students need to register in D1 at lunchtime on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> February.

Years 9 & 10: Thursday 7th March: 3 - 5pm

Year 9 & 10 students need to register in D1 at lunchtime on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March.

You will be asked to write your name down on a list, then given a number to wear on a label during your audition.

### What will happen at the audition?

You will be auditioning simply for a place in the production rather than a specific character part. The Performing Arts team will cast the show based on who we feel fits the roles the best.

For your **singing audition** we will be teaching you to sing 'Tomorrow' from Annie. You do not have to learn the words to the song as they will be provided for you. For your **dance audition** we will teach you some original choreography from 'It's the Hard Knock Life'. Again, you do not have to prepare anything for this but it might make you feel more comfortable if you were to listen to the tracks a few times before the audition. You will be able to find them on Spotify or you could find the Annie soundtrack on YouTube by clicking this link:

For your **acting audition** you will be asked to prepare a performance of <u>one</u> of the four extracts attached. You can either pair/group up with another actor who is also auditioning, or you could prepare your preferred part and be paired/grouped up during the audition. A good audition will make the lines of dialogue spring from the page and come to life. You do not necessarily have to learn the lines, but please do not bury your head in the script! It would also be useful for us if you could attempt an American (New York) accent. Be ready to incorporate lots of movement and varied yocal skills.

Please find the audition script extracts attached below. You can choose from any of the four extracts. Three of them are duologues and one of the extracts requires a group of three. Please choose one that you think suits you and your partner/group the best.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

### What do I wear to my audition?

Feel free to change into something easy to move in such as leggings or jogging bottoms. For dancing, bare feet are preferable.

### Will the audition be scary?

No! You will not be asked to sing or dance on your own; you will perform everything along with other students from your year group. You will be working with the usual, normal and lovely Performing Arts team who you know well so, give it a go! We can't wait to see you.

### Will I get a good role if I'm in Year 7 or 8?

Named character parts will always go to the student who we feel best suits the role, regardless of how old you are – so give the audition a go! Our philosophy is and has always been that 'everyone is important'. If you are lucky enough to gain a part in a musical number, then own that part and give it everything you've got!

# Will I definitely get into the production if I audition?

This is all dependent on how many students we have auditioning. We would like to have a large but manageable cast in the production so this may mean that some students don't get a role this time. If you don't get a role this year – try again next year.
