Students have been exploring how powerful speakers from history, such as JFK, make use of rhetorical methods such as extended metaphor, analogy and emotive

vocabulary. Students then planned and crafted their own persuasive speech on a topic or issue that they felt strongly about. Each Year 9 English class chose a class representative who delivered their speech to the whole of their year group.

The students that performed for us blew us away with their talent, passion and expertly crafted speeches. There was a range of topics that were spoken about; these ranged from racism and sexism to the use of VAR, fast fashion and the ancient craft of blacksmithing. Every single one of the speakers were a credit to the school and should be incredibly proud of their performance. They spoke powerfully, thoughtfully and with conviction. 
