Duke of Edinburgh Award Year 10-Mrs Quigley (Teacher of Maths)



At the start of Year 10, students have the exciting opportunity to take part in the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award. This nationally recognised programme helps young people develop essential life skills such as teamwork, organisation, independence, and leadership.

Following an application process, 40–50 students are selected each year to complete the award over a six-month period. They work towards four sections: *Skills*, *Physical*, *Volunteering*, and *Expedition*.

Last year's participants embraced a wide variety of challenges—from learning Latin and volunteering at a local temple to supporting conservation efforts at Valley Park and completing a 30km expedition through the New Forest. Reflecting on the experience, one student said, "During the Expedition one of our team had terrible blisters and we had to really work as a team to get everyone through to the end."

Just before the Easter break, we celebrated the achievements of twenty-three students who successfully completed the award. They were presented with their certificates by Mrs Lowing at a special celebration lunch—with plenty of well-earned pizza!



Year 7 Shakespeare Festival- Miss Potter (Teacher of English)



Before Easter Year 7 took part in their Shakespeare festival. Each class is given a scene from A Midsummer Night's Dream which they explore through language analysis, before rehearsing and performing it as a class in Thornden Hall.

All of the students take part in their scene, whether they are performing, creating props and costumes, designing the sound or the lighting. It was incredible to see all of the students taking part and being so professional with their scenes and being such a supportive audience.

We had some wonderful interpretations and fabulous designs for the show which you can see in the photos we captured. We asked the students after their performance to tell us what they enjoyed the most, and it was so wonderful to hear all the students supporting one another and complimenting the designs and costumes created. We are looking forward to seeing next year's students performing it!

New Anti-Bullying Policy-Mrs Kehoe (Assistant Headteacher)



Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to update you on the progress we have made since introducing our new anti-bullying policy and stepped approach, which came into effect on 18th November.

Since its implementation, we have recorded **92 reported incidents**, which reflects the increased confidence of our students in speaking out and seeking support. Of these incidents:

- 23 have involved physical behaviour.
- 69 have been verbal incidents.

As part of our commitment to ensuring that bullying is taken seriously, we have applied a range of appropriate consequences and interventions. Some examples of these, include:

- Issuing external suspensions of varying lengths.
- Processing internal suspensions.
- Thornden students working in Toynbee's Isolation Room as part of our Cross School Inclusion Programme.
- Student behaviour contracts with clear expectations and monitoring in place.
- The use of Thornden's Restorative Behaviour Day.

We continue to prioritise the wellbeing and safety of all students. Our pastoral and safeguarding teams remain committed to supporting those affected by bullying and working with those who require intervention to address their behaviours.

Our recent student voice indicates how our continued work around anti-bullying is having a positive impact on the way students feel when they are at school.

Student A: I went to the Wellbeing Den, and I spoke to Mrs Kingsley-Smith. I felt better but I still did not want the other students to be told. The school said they would inform my Head of Year and reassured me that they would pass on that I did not want the other students approached knowing a report had come from me. They offered to talk to the student, but I declined, understanding that it would be hard for the school to deal with the situation. Instead, my

teachers were asked to keep an eye out in lessons. Staff in the Wellbeing Den have checked in with me since I first reported it.

Student B: I spoke to my Mum, and she contacted the school on my behalf. I spoke to Mrs Kehoe. I felt reassured knowing that the incident was being dealt with in detail and quickly. School spoke to the students, called home and gave them sanctions. The school kept my Mum updated the whole time. A member of staff informed me about the actions taken. I have been checked on throughout the term multiple times, especially by my tutor.

Whilst students tell us they are more comfortable in reporting bullying type behaviours, we recognise that there is still some work to be done in tackling the perception of a "snitch" culture, which can sometimes prevent students from reporting unkind or harmful behaviour. We want to reinforce that Thornden is a *telling school*, where every student feels safe and confident to speak up when they witness bullying or unacceptable behaviour. Reporting concerns is not about getting others into trouble—it is about ensuring that all members of our school community are treated with kindness and respect. We actively encourage our students to be *upstanders*, not bystanders, by standing against bullying and supporting their peers. By fostering a culture of openness and responsibility, we can work together to create a school environment where everyone feels valued and supported.

We are grateful for your ongoing support in reinforcing the importance of kindness, respect, and responsible behaviour both in and out of school.

MFL Department-Mr Tully

This is one of the busiest half terms of the year for the Modern Foreign Languages team with speaking exams currently taking place and our exchanges to both France and Spain going out very soon.

Year 7 have made fantastic progress since September and this half term is no exception. We are immensely proud of the way that they have started their language-learning journey at Thornden and their grammatical understanding is improving all of the time. Duolingo Club continues to go from strength to strength and it has been lovely to see so many Year 7 members attending each and every week.

Students in Year 8 French are currently studying the topic of house and home, learning about different types of houses, rooms and items of furniture. The culmination of this work will be them designing their own 'house of the future' and we are very much looking forward to seeing their creativity in action. Year 8 Spanish students are wrapping up a very successful unit of work on holidays with a speaking assessment before shortly moving on to their new topic of food and drink. This is a fantastic springboard for talking about Spanish culture and it will be interesting to explore the differences between Spanish and English culinary habits. Year 8 German students are currently completing their unit on holidays, during which they have been learning different forms of the past tense and expanding their knowledge of the German-speaking world.

Students in Year 9 have now chosen their options and we have been delighted to learn that many students will be continuing their language-learning journey with us into Years 10 and 11. In Spanish, students will soon be starting a new topic on jobs and future plans. German students will be learning key vocab for travelling to German-speaking countries, while French students will be studying holidays. All of these topics will provide opportunities for students to expand and strengthen their knowledge of using different tenses.

Year 10 are working hard on their brand-new GCSE course. This year group are the first to be assessed against a new specification and will be studying topics such as celebrity culture that were not part of the previous course. We are very fortunate at Thornden to be able to offer students two realistic practice speaking exams with external invigilators (one in Year 10 and one in Year 11) which support their understanding of what the real exam will be like and help them to feel prepared. Students prepare with the invigilator and then sit the exam itself with their class teacher.

Year 11, on the other hand, have almost completed their speaking exams and their attention is now shifting towards the reading, listening and writing papers. We understand that this is a busy and stressful time for students, but would like to reassure them (and you!) that we are here to support them through this period. We have every faith in Year 11 and look forward to celebrating their amazing achievements with them in August. Keep going, Year 11 - a very long summer is just around the corner!

As well as the exchanges and working hard to bring our curriculum to life for our students, staff are also making preparations for our upcoming trips to Barcelona and Stuttgart in the Autumn Term. Travel is a fantastic opportunity for students to put language learning in context and apply their skills, and our staff are so looking forward to sharing their passion for the countries that they love with our students.

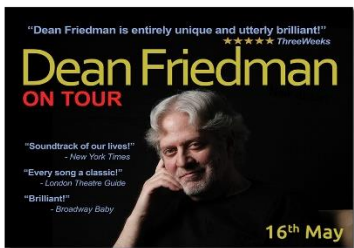
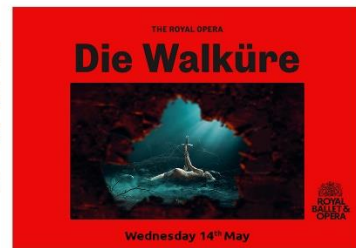
