### Work Experience 2025



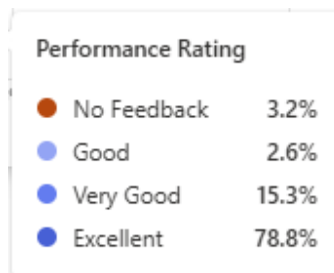
Our Year 11 students have started their final year at Thornden School with a real bang! Thanks to the way the term dates fell, they were in school for a day before going off to their various work experience placements. Whilst they were in school, we were able to talk to them in an assembly about professionalism and expectations during their week at work. The students clearly took our advice and guidance on board because we have had some of the best feedback ever from their time on placements.

We call each employer during the week to check on the students, their activities, performance etc and 94% of them identified our students to be 'excellent' or 'very good'. So many members of staff have been to see me to say how lovely their conversations were and how many employers commented on the students being a credit to the school.

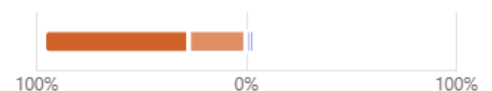
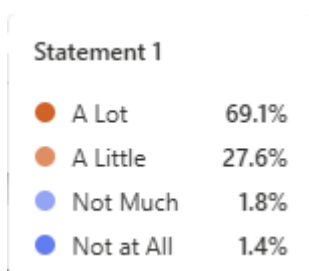
Performance Rating



On their return we also ask the students to reflect on their placements. A huge 96.7% of them enjoyed their placements, predominantly 'a lot'

As with other years, our students have been out and about doing some amazing things. We had students in Scotland doing geological work, working on IT projects in Stuttgart, building houses, working in schools, working with animals, presenting a radio show on Outreach Radio and the list goes on.



Work experience is a fantastic opportunity for students to test out an industry or a particular job role. Once they are in Year 11, they have to start making decisions about their future and we want to ensure they have all the necessary information, advice and guidance they require to make the best decisions for themselves. Work experience is a huge part of that, even for those students who now know what they don't want to do!



Numerous students have fed back that they have been offered further experience in the future or even jobs.

## Safeguarding-Mr Thomas (Deputy Headteacher and DSL)

### Safeguarding Update – What We’re Doing to Support Our Students This Half Term

Dear Parents / Carers,

As part of our ongoing commitment to keeping all students safe, we want to share with you the measures and support we have put in place this half term. We believe that safeguarding is a partnership between school, students, and families — so please do read on to see how we’re working together.

#### What we’ve put in place:

1. **“Report a Concern” link on Satchel**

Students have access to a “Report a Concern” link via Satchel, our online system. This gives them a private and straightforward way to tell us if they are worried about something—whether it’s happening to them or someone else. We encourage all students to use this link if they feel they need help, or if they notice something that doesn’t seem right.

2. **Safeguarding assemblies**

Last week, we held whole-school assemblies, where we talked through our safeguarding processes: how students can report concerns, what happens once a concern is raised, and who is responsible for keeping students safe. We wanted to make sure all pupils understand the steps we take and who they can talk to.

3. **New Safeguarding Curriculum in Tutor Time**

Starting this half term, every Wednesday morning in tutor time, students will engage with our new Safeguarding Curriculum. This half term focuses on Health and Wellbeing as we know from previous patterns that this half term is the one when students find they need more support. We believe that regular, structured discussion is key to helping students build confidence and resilience.

4. **Kooth visits and assemblies this week**

We’re pleased to have Kooth, a wellbeing and mental health support service, visiting the school this week. They will run assemblies for all year groups, introducing their services and showing students how to access mental health support when they need it.

#### How you can help:

- **Talk at home.** Chat with your child about online safety, what to do if they feel upset or worried, and reassure them it’s okay to reach out.
- **Remind them about reporting.** Make sure your child knows about the Report a Concern link on Satchel and feels that using it is safe and supported.
- **Familiarise yourself with Kooth.** It’s helpful to know what Kooth offers so you and your child can take advantage of it if needed.

We are committed to making our school a safe, supportive environment where every student knows they have someone to turn to, and where their voice is heard. Thank you for your continued support.



Dear Parent/Carer,

Kooth online therapeutic support is live here at Thornden School. The service is funded and endorsed by the NHS, allowing for completely free access to all schools and services working with young people in Hampshire and many other areas nationally.

As the Engagement Lead for Kooth I am working closely with staff in school to deliver training on all aspects of how Kooth works and supports your child. As well as having the opportunity to hear much more about Kooth services, we also have a range of physical and digital promotional resources that are being used around school to promote the service & remind students Kooth is here to help 24/7 365 days of the year.

Kooth offers free access to online counselling, support and advice for children and young people (CYP) aged 11 to 25 years old.

There is no threshold, it is anonymous and there are no waiting list processes. Children and young people can access support for ANY issues they may be experiencing. These may include; Body image, self-esteem, bereavement, academic pressures, anger, anxiety, suicidal thoughts, friendships, sexuality, transition from primary to secondary school etc.

The registration process is quick, anonymous and safe. CYP can access support, simply by visiting here: [www.kooth.com](http://www.kooth.com)

Kooth's qualified therapists are online 365 days a year. Monday to Friday, from midday until 10pm and on weekends, 6pm until 10pm.

As well as chatting to therapists on the Kooth text based counselling service, young people can message the Kooth team 24 hours a day and access fully-moderated support forums, online magazine articles and other self-help tools. 80% of the magazine is written by Kooth users and every young person can write articles on a huge range of current topics ranging from emotional health, sport, technology, fashion etc. Everything on Kooth is moderated before going 'live' on the site allowing for young people to offer and receive peer support in a safe and secure online environment.

Kooth delivers 1000's of counselling sessions each year in Local Authorities across the UK. As 50% of referrals to CAMHS are deemed inappropriate to their criteria, Kooth gives schools, professionals and families an alternative way of ensuring children and Young People can access free support when they need it, in a way that they find comfortable to access, via internet enabled devices.

**Department Spotlight-** Each newsletter we will shine a spotlight on the work of one of our fantastic departments.

### **Miss Stickland Head of BTEC Enterprise** **BTEC Enterprise**

Alongside the range of GCSEs offered at Thornden School, we also provide the BTEC Enterprise course. This is equivalent to a GCSE but works slightly differently. The course is made up of 60% coursework and 40% exam. For those students who are concerned about exams or who simply prefer to work in a different way, it is an ideal alternative to the traditional route.

Throughout the 2 years we cover 3 components:

- **Component 1: Exploring Enterprises**
- **Component 2: Planning and Presenting a Micro Enterprise Idea**
- **Component 3: Marketing and Finance for Enterprise**

Component 1 is a coursework unit and worth 30% of the student's final grade. We investigate local businesses, their size, how they are owned, what skills the entrepreneur has needed to make them successful, what market research they do and how they use it and finally the internal and external influences on the business that can help or hinder their performance.

Component 2 is another coursework unit worth 30% of the final grade and is my favourite unit. Students are given a budget of £50 (not real, much to the students upset!) and they have to come up with a business idea that a teenager could realistically set up and run. We have had all sorts of ideas in the past – dog walking, lawn mowing, car washes, jewellery making, cupcakes, candles, t-shirts and the list goes on. Students research 2 potential ideas, pick one and then complete a full business plan as if they were going to pitch it to investors. Once they have completed their plan they present it to me and I channel my inner Deborah Meaden like I am on the panel of Dragons Den. The students are always nervous but every year they have done me proud and produced some really professional and engaging pitches. Their final task in this unit is to watch their presentations and review their performance. They are always much tougher on themselves than I am!



Component 3 is the examined unit, worth 40% of the final grade. It is synoptic and brings in everything they have learnt from the previous 2 units along with some new concepts in the fields of marketing and finance. This time it is based around a fictional business and challenges students to apply what they have learnt to an unknown scenario. For example, advising a business on which promotional methods to use or completing a profit and loss account for them.

A common question about the course is how it compares to GCSE Business. There are some topic cross overs, but the main difference is they cover more topics in less depth, and we cover fewer topics in more depth. If students prefer to have 2 years to learn the content and then demonstrate their knowledge in the exams, then GCSE is for them. If students would rather complete independent work earlier and spread their assessments out, then BTEC Enterprise

would work well for them. However, it is not an easy option, students have to be self-motivated, organised, meet deadlines, act on feedback and write at length, starting in Year 10. For some this is a little early but for those who do choose the course what a range of excellent transferable skills they develop. What is great is students can study business in whichever way suits them.

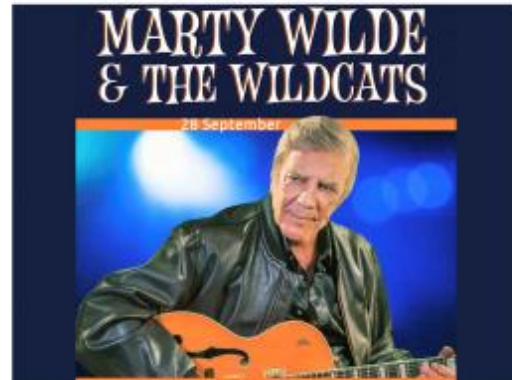

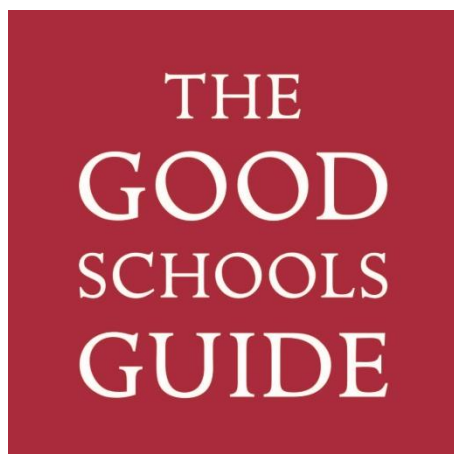
