Mrs Grove ran a number of clay workshops during children's mental health week. She worked with the students to create various decoration from air-drying clay. The students really enjoyed themselves.



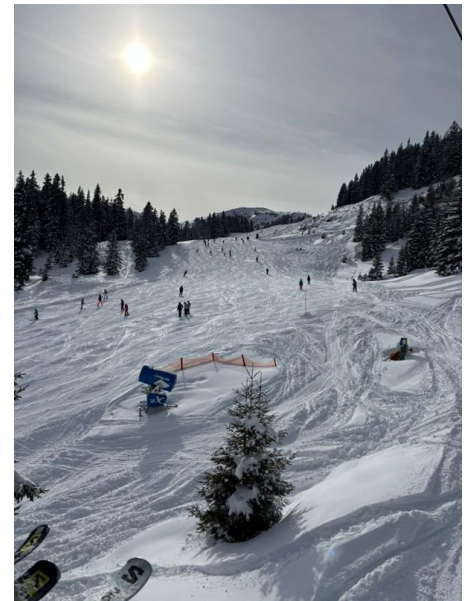


Alpendorf Ski Trip 2026-Mr Hall (Head of PE)



Over half term, a group of 40 students travelled to Alpendorf in Austria for what turned out to be a truly memorable week on the slopes.

We were welcomed by fresh snowfall on our first morning, followed by bright blue skies in the afternoon. It set the tone for the week ahead. Conditions were outstanding, with regular snowfall providing fresh powder and several classic alpine bluebird days where the mountains looked at their absolute best.



Progress on the Slopes

From complete beginners to our advanced skiers, the progress across all four groups was exceptional.

Our beginner students, many of whom had never skied before, showed real courage and determination. By the end of the week they were confidently tackling challenging terrain, including a steep red run. Watching their journey from the nursery slopes to higher sections of the mountain was a real highlight.

The intermediate group developed strong parallel turns and explored new areas of the mountain, growing in both skill and independence.

Our advanced group covered serious distance across the resort, clocking up big mileage each day and skiing at an impressive standard. What stood out most was not just their speed and ability, but the way they looked after one another throughout. It was a great example of teamwork and shared responsibility.

Across the board, confidence grew daily. Students pushed themselves outside their comfort zones, showed resilience after the occasional tumble, and supported each other every step of the way.

We are already looking forward to returning to Austria in February 2027 for the next chapter of this fantastic trip.

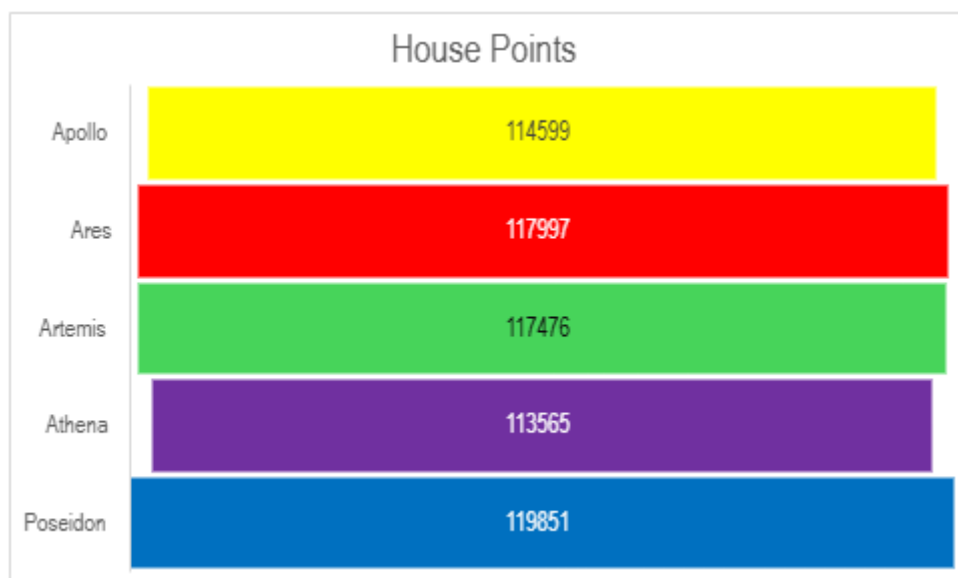

Atlassian Williams F1 Racing STEM Visit-Miss Stickland (BTEC Enterprise and Careers Lead)

On Wednesday 25th February, Thornden students got to experience some of the glamour of Formula One! 39 lucky students and 5 members of staff got up extra early to get to the Experience Centre in Oxford by 8.45.



We started the day splitting into 2 groups. One group (Year 10s) went straight onto the racing simulators. 19 students and one member of staff racing against each other across several of the F1 tracks around the world. Monaco was a particular 'favourite', especially when the rain started and the full damage button was enabled. Whilst that carnage ensued, the other group (Year 9s) went to the heritage museum to learn about the history of the sport and the Williams team, getting to see in person some of the most famous cars to ever race in Formula one.

We even got to hold Alex Albon's actual helmet and George Russell's Steering wheel



With activities complete the 2 groups swapped.

After a short pitstop to refuel, students started a STEM workshop. They were told about the nose cone of an F1 car and why it is designed the way it is. They were then each given 2 sheets of A4 paper. Their task was to protect a ball of plasticine by using their paper to create a crumple zone that would prevent the ball from being damaged. In teams they had to pick which design they thought was the most effective and send that person to the stage. Students put their ball and crumple zone design into a tube and one by one had to drop a heavy weight onto the ball at the bottom – results were mixed to say the least!



With that learning under their belts, the main task began. Students were given a £100,000 budget, resources they could buy and the challenge of designing a nose cone that would protect a driver's legs in the event of a crash. They could create 2 prototypes and test them in the crash test simulator before taking their feedback and then creating their final design which would again be tested in a replica crash test simulator. Students were also asked to create a marketing campaign they had to present from the stage, explaining why their idea would work and be the best.



The winning team was declared, each winning an Atlassian Williams cap.

Nobody went home empty handed. Each student received a goody bag full of Williams merchandise, an insulated water bottle, pen, charger and bag!

It was a fantastic day where students got to see STEM in action in one of the most exhilarating industries in the world. The students were wonderful and represented Thornden impeccably. Well done to all involved.

Student Parliament Training- Mrs Oliver (Teacher in English)

Our students participated in an engaging leadership workshop led by Unloc, where they explored what it truly means to be a strong and effective leader. Throughout the training, students learned about the qualities of good leadership, how to communicate clearly and confidently, and how to strengthen their public speaking skills.

In addition, students focused on:

- What makes a good communicator
- Critical thinking and problem-solving skills
- How to gather and represent student opinions respectfully and responsibly

The training also included inspiring guest speakers and entrepreneurs from a variety of industries. These professionals shared their personal leadership journeys, career experiences, and advice on teamwork, innovation, and perseverance. Students had the opportunity to ask thoughtful questions and learn how leadership skills apply in real-world settings.

As part of their leadership development, students have also worked together to identify six key strands that will guide the focus of Student Parliament this year:

2. Education and Study
3. Charity and Fundraising
4. Health and Wellbeing
5. Diversity and Inclusion
6. Active



These strands will help students plan projects, gather student voice, and represent the interests and needs of the wider school community in a meaningful and structured way.

This experience helped our Student Parliament members grow in confidence, collaboration, and responsibility as they prepare to represent their peers and make a positive impact in our school community.

Faith Mahoney from Unloc said: I thoroughly enjoyed working with the Thornden School student leaders over our three days together. During the leadership training, we explored effective leadership, the importance of teamwork and communication and developed their public speaking skills. They put all of their hard work into presentations on the final day detailing their ideas for improving the school and local community. They approached all of the activities and discussions with great enthusiasm, creativity and passion. I am so excited to see what they group of young people achieve in their strands and in their bright futures.

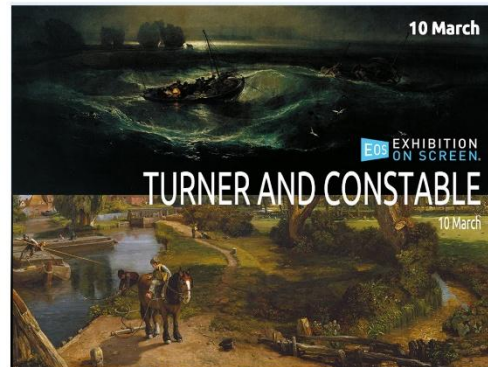

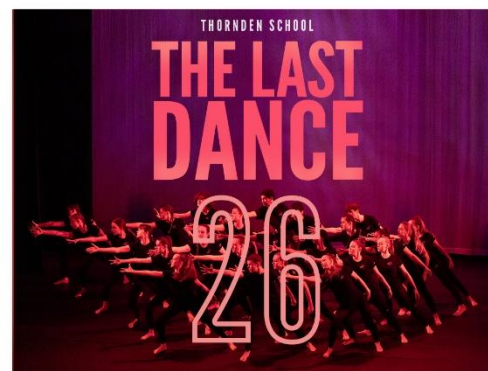

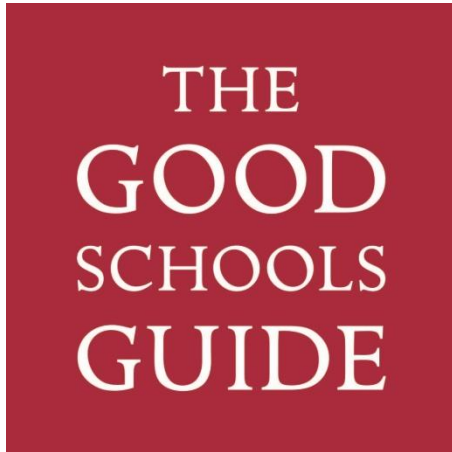
